On the Upper East Side, swing by the New York School of Interior Design (170 E. 70th St., NYC, nysid.edu) until **May 10** to take in the work of Munich-based artist Felix Rodewaldt, whose installment for NYSID's "Rooms" is the first of an exhibition series exploring the overlap between contemporary art and interior design.
